She met the love of her life James Ohlaug and prior to his leaving to the Korean War they were united in marriage on October 29, 1950. After the war Grace and her family lived on a farm near Madison. Grace raised her children Deanne and David and also worked as an executive secretary at the Madison Nursing Home. In 1961 Grace and Jim sold the farm and moved to St. Cloud, MN where she worked as a secretary for the Sauk Rapids School District Superintendent. Grace and Jim moved to Alexandria in 1974 and bought Cottage Grove Resort on Lake Andrew. Together they operated the resort and Grace routinely cleaned the cabins and socialized with the campers. After seven years they sold the resort and moved back to St. Cloud, MN only to find out they missed the resort life and three years later returned to Alexandria and purchased Tip Top Cove Resort on Lake Miltona. They enjoyed their time on Lake Miltona and later sold the resort, retired and moved to Alexandria. Grace was a gracious woman who was always courteous to other people and willing to help anyone. She liked to visit with her friends and loved to spoil her grandchildren. Grace was very involved with Shalom Lutheran Church in Alexandria where she attended Sunday services and was the church financial secretary.
